- Private or out of state schools come up with there won admission standards.
- If you don't meet standards admission may still be possible but the student may need to take remedial courses that may not count to graduation, during the first year of study.
- For those that are interested in law but do not have the income to afford both college and law school. There are apprenticeship programs for those that would like to study for and take the bar but do not have a college degree.
- Students who take college track courses have a higher rate of graduation. The curriculum tends to be more rigorous but also more interesting and engaging.
- Early college start classes are offered at ACC with not tuition for local High School students after the 10<sup>th</sup> grade year.
- 25% of jobs require a 4-year degree.
- AVID is an elective class, which allows for students to have the analytical and study skills they will need for college level work.
