




## The Building Blocks: Pebbles, Boulders and Buckets



## The Bucket (bond capacity)

The bucket is the total bond capacity. This could be between \$1.2-\$1.5 billion. The bucket can only hold a certain dollar amount.





## Pebbles & Boulders (needs)



Pebbles represent small \$ projects and purchases such as:

- Roof repairs
- HVAC systems
- Plumbing
- Electrical upgrades, etc.



Boulders represent large **\$\$\$** projects such as:

- Modernizations
- New schools
- Land purchases
- Large athletics facilities
- Fine arts facilities, etc.



#### **Current Needs**

- 2017 FMP identified \$4 billion worth of facility needs
  - The 2017 Bond total was \$1.05 billion of which about \$800 million went to facility needs
- 2022
  - FCA Deficiencies
  - ESA Deficiencies
  - LRP will identify both facility <u>and</u> non-facility needs
    - Academics + CTE
    - Athletics
    - Facilities
    - Fine Arts
    - Safety + Security
    - Technology
    - Transportation
  - Other departmental needs identified during process


Staff anticipates a significant gap in 2022 between need and funding ability.



## **Takeaways**








#### Possible buckets

Certain items, such as athletics, fine arts and technology, have to be separate stand-alone bond propositions. There could be multiple buckets, but the total is still \$1.2-1.5 billion.

## **Takeaways**

- Each pebble and boulder will be assigned a cost estimate
  - FCA/ESA these deficiencies are all individually considered pebbles
  - LRP There are seven committees and each committee will provide a list priorities for the bond. The LRP recommendations will be made up of pebbles and boulders.
  - Other needs identified through further review and discussions with campus communities
- There will likely be multiple buckets, splitting our bonding capacity into different bond props
- AISD's needs will exceed the capacity of the buckets






**Example: LRP Facilities + FCA/ESA**


**Example: Facilities + SSR** 




Since the facility will be modernized, a secure vestibule is included in that cost. The remaining total for district-wide secure vestibules is reduced.


