
The district and 111 campuses earned the state's top rating of Met Standard or Met Alternative Standard.

70 schools earned a total of 205 distinction designations for outstanding achievement relative to a group of 40 comparable campuses:









2013-14 STAAR/EOC Percent of Students Who Met or Exceeded Progress Measure




2013-14 STAAR/EOC Percent of Students Who Exceeded Progress Measure




Teachers Profile






