
Guiding Principles





 The first four weeks of school will be remote campus learning: Sept 8 - Oct 5

- Austin ISD will follow health guidance from local, state and federal officials in order to make the best decisions to keep our students and families safe

- Health screenings take place prior to campus entry

- COVID-19 Response Protocol and contact tracing






Health Screenings

- COVID-19 Screen & Go on AISD Mobile App
- Take place in vehicles when possible and will take place prior to campus entry.
- Screenings will use "no-touch" thermometers.
- Student and staff respond to a short series of screening questions.
- If student/staff fails screening, they will be sent home immediately and will be asked to quarantine for 14 days
- The district will follow CDC guidelines regarding quarantine protocols.

Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for Operations: Furniture Largott and Room Setup This SOP is to assist in the furniture layout of classroom spaces to ensure social distancing and other safety procedures are followed. I. Sunitizing Stations Provide a table or desk in an accessible location (preferably near classroom entrance) for hand sanitizer, disinfectant wipes, and educator gloves for food distribution. All of these materials will be purchased certrally and distributed to campuses. II. Furniture Layout: Classrooms and Staging Room Exemple soft furnishings, soft toys and toys that are hard to clean (such as those with intricate parts). Arrange student furniture within the plussroom to accommodate social distancing. Each student station (either desks or tables) must maintain a minimum of six. feet spacing between students in all directions. Arrange furniture keeping in mind the space required for teaching walls, excess furniture-storage, and pirculation to student restrooms and storage, etc. Measure and tape off new furniture anangement to assure correct furniture placement. U. Anticipate approximately 25% of the classroom capacity (based on.) student staff ratios): 6 - 8 students per classroom for elementary schools; and. 2 7 - 9 students per classroom for secondary schools. Remove unnecessary chairs or seating areas to discourage student gathering. Alternately, stack and store essess furniture within the claseroom, taping off the area te-discourage student gathering. Refer to the following statches for examples of furniture layout, larging in mind that a variety of classroom layouts exist and each may accommodate more or fewer student.

Cleaning Protocols

Implement robust cleaning procedures:

- Clean high touch surfaces multiple times a day (bathrooms, handles, office equipment)
- Daily cleaning of the entire campus
- Deep cleaning on a weekly basis
- Disinfection stations for students and staff upon arrival
- Areas will be wiped down before and after use
- Display effective sanitation measures
- Educate staff on proper hygiene and cleaning procedures







All PPE purchased and distributed centrally to supply **CAMPUS KITS**:

- Masks (Staff and students will be encouraged to bring their own masks, however each person who arrives without a mask will be provided with one.)
- Gloves
- Hand sanitizer*
- Disinfecting wipes*
- "No-touch" thermometers
- **Eye protection** for health screeners
- **Signage** package




Timeline (approximate):


