PROCEEDINGS

Preliminaries

- The meeting was called to order by Dr. Jane Ross at 5:01 in the library of Summitt Elementary School.
- There were no public comments.
- Under comments from members, Joey Crumley announced that the district was still looking for volunteers, particularly teachers and students, to serve on the upcoming Strategic Planning Advisory Committee.

Superintendent's Update

- Dr. Jacob Reach, Chief of Staff, provided an update that included the following points:
 - The Board is continuing to work on its pieces of the new strategic plan.
 - The annual district demographic report was presented to the Board last week, and highlights included:
 - The first time since 2011-12 there has been an increase in district enrollment
 - Out-of-district enrollment has grown significantly
 - We're continuing to expand our PK3 and PK4 enrollment
 - The full report is available online
 - The Board will be hearing the district's financial forecast next week, including:
 - The tax rate will decrease slightly
 - Recapture is down, but we're still giving more than anyone else in the state
 - Our fund balance is still healthy, but we'd like to reinforce it
 - We're revisiting stipends
 - We want to make strong investments into academically struggling schools, and into school safety
 - We will continue to build up early literacy supports
- Discussion points included:
 - The current fund balance is about \$290 million (we're required to have at least \$150 million).
 - We're looking into the pay scale for special education staff to make sure we're competitive.
 - We're hearing different stories about special education caseloads.
 - We're bringing in some contracted special education services.
 - From the city's point of view, in the future we should see condos and townhomes becoming more occupied by a different demographic.
 - We may be looking at funding full-day PK3.

District Organization Update

- Dr. Reach provided an update that included the following points:
 - There is not a lot to report on this right now.
 - We've increased staff in central offices who support schools, such that they can be on campuses more.
 - Principals are generally saying good things about this change.
 - Parents are feeling that there's no one to talk to directly at the district level when they have issues or concerns.
 - The Academics team was also reorganized four curriculum areas were consolidated into two, with more staff dedicated to literacy and early childhood education.
 - The district organizational chart online doesn't go down very far in levels.
 - Due to various other duties, not all elementary school executive directors have the same number of principals reporting to them.
 - Now, facility maintenance has its own director and assigned staff, making them more responsive to needs.

School Changes Update

- Dr. Reach provided an update that included the following points:
 - For the schools that have been consolidated, there are transition teams made up of various campus staff, and the teams give regular reports to the Board.
 - New schools are continuing to open under our last bond program.
 - The Board may have further discussions on possible other consolidations.
 - Cultural proficiency efforts are being ramped up.
 - We're continuing to discuss possible shared facility usage with the city.
- Discussion points included:
 - We haven't finalized the reuse of the Pease campus.
 - The Equity Officer came onboard in August and has been involved in the process since that time.
 - Extended days are starting at the consolidated schools, and we're looking at student care until 6:00 p.m. We'll assess how this goes, and then look at expanding to other campuses.

District of Innovation Plan Amendment

- Norma Castillo, Director of Talent Acquisition and Development, and Katy Escandell, Director of Academics, went over the following points:
 - The district is facing a lake of CALTs, and inequities where they are stationed.
 - In addition to CALT accreditation, currently CALTs must also have a teaching certificate, and there are continuing education requirements. It has become harder to acquire them and to keep them.
 - The DOI plan allows CTE instructors to not have a teaching certificate, but most have industry certification
 - We now want to do this with CALTs, but they would still need CALT accreditation or be very close to getting it.
- Discussion points included:
 - These people would be similar to reading specialists.
 - There is a concern about providing people training, then having them leave, so we may want to consider a minimum time agreement.
 - It's not correct to say that all kids are getting the dyslexia services that they need.
 - All dyslexic kids can learn if they receive the help they need when they need it.
 - There's an argument to be made that CALT accreditation is more important than having a teaching certificate the therapy is what's needed. In other words, a teaching certificate may not ensure better provision of needed services.

- We still need to ensure that kids with reading needs other than dyslexia get the help they need.
- We need to not pull kids away from the normal school day to get therapy before or after school would be better.
- It would be best to stipulate in the DOI plan exactly what CALTs will have as duties we don't want them to end up doing all kinds of other things.
- We don't want to see CALTs replacing literacy specialists.
- There needs to be more specificity about persons who are very close to receiving CALT accreditation they can't drag it out too long.
- The DAC moved to support the proposed amendments, with three dissenting votes.
