Impact of School Health

Why we do what we do

District-wide impact of school health

- Better test scores correlate with better FitnessGram scores
- "Unhealthy" BMI leads to lower test scores
- Unhealthy students miss more school days
- Teenage pregnancy results in poor attendance and dropout
- Violence, bullying, and dating abuse can lead to low selfesteem, poor academic performance, and missed school days



Accomplishments & Recommendations What have we done

- Made recommendations regarding the roll-out of unassigned epi pens for all district campuses;
- Monitored the Revolution Foods pilot at O'Henry Middle School, and requested additional information;
- Provided input on hiring of new Director of Nutrition Services;
- Updated district wellness policy to reflect federal nutrition legislation;
